PASTOR'S NOTES

What was your experience last Saturday? I was shocked at the violence that was displayed during the Trump rally in Butler, PA. It was disturbing, sad, scary and confusing.

The week before, I had been on vacation with my family in Florida and toward the end of the time, my father collapsed and we had a very scary moment. He is fine now and I am grateful. However, it startled me. It made me reflect on the shortness of life. It reminded me that I will not have my parents forever. It caused me to realize that things can change in an instant. And the violence displayed last Saturday stressed that point even more.

My heart breaks for the family of Corey Comperatore. By all accounts we was a loving husband and father, a practicing Catholic and a dedicated fighter who covered his family to protect them. He was killed by a bullet intended for President Trump. How the life of that family and that community and our nation changed in an instant because of an evil choice by an individual? Please pray for that family and the others who were wounded by this heinous act of evil.

How do we reconcile this in our minds and our hearts? How do we respond as Catholic Christians? These questions cannot be answered in a short reflection. But St. Paul tells us today in his letter to the Ephesians referring to Jesus, "He is our Peace...He came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near, for through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father." A Catholic Christian vision reminds us that we are one human family. We pray "Our Father not my Father." We are called to love our brothers and sisters. We are even challenged to love "our enemies." This is the real call to be an authentic disciple of Jesus Christ.

Jesus is the source of authentic peace. Peace is a fruit of the Holy Spirit. Peace is not something that we can self-generate. We must go to the source. First, we must deepen our prayer life. We must strive to listen to His voice, not the voice of the secular world. Second, we must remember that we are called to be an instrument of peace. All of us must examine our conscience, how am I contributing or diminishing peace in my life? With the help of God, we strive to align our life to Jesus Christ. Yes, we live in a broken world, a world torn by strife, on the spiritual level, a world run by the Enemy. However, Jesus came into this world to save us and to rescue us. He reminds us in the Gospel of John, 'In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have overcome the world.' Our peace is in union with Him.

As we mourn the loss of life, we must also reassess our relationship with God. How well do I reflect God's priorities? Or am I projecting my own agenda? Let me close with these words, "Let us take this moment to pray for unity and an end to violence and inflammatory rhetoric in our community and across our nation. Let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me."


We are pleased to announce that we have received the date for Confirmation. Confirmation will be conferred on all prepared candidates on:

Reminder: only students who have completed 2 years of Religious Education and were in the 7th Grade Confirmation Class, this past year, will be confirmed.



COMUNIDAD HISPANA

ESCRITORIO DEL PASTOR

¿Cuál fue tu experiencia el pasado sábado? Me conmocionó la violencia que se desplegó durante el mitin de Trump en Butler, Pensilvania. Fue inquietante, triste, aterrador y confuso.

La semana anterior, había estado de vacaciones con mi familia en Florida y hacia el final del tiempo, mi padre se desmayó y tuvimos un momento muy aterrador. Ahora está bien y le estoy agradecida. Sin embargo, me sobresaltó. Me hizo reflexionar sobre la brevedad de la vida. Me recordó que no tendré a mis padres para siempre. Me hizo darme cuenta de que las cosas pueden cambiar en un instante. Y la violencia mostrada el pasado sábado acentuó aún más ese punto.

Mi corazón se rompe por la familia de Corey Comperatore. Segundo todos los indicios, era un marido y un padre cariñoso, un católico practicante y un luchador dedicado que cubría a su familia para protegerla. Fue asesinado por una bala destinada al presidente Trump. ¿Cómo la vida de esa familia y esa comunidad y nuestra nación cambió en un instante debido a una elección malvada de un individuo? Por favor, reza por esa familia y por los demás que resultaron heridos por este atroz acto de maldad.

¿Cómo conciliamos esto en nuestras mentes y nuestros corazones? ¿Cómo respondemos como cristianos católicos? Estas preguntas no pueden responderse en una breve reflexión. Pero San Pablo nos dice hoy en su carta a los Efesios refiriéndose a Jesús: "Porque él es nuestra paz...Vino para anunciar la buena nueva de la paz, tanto a ustedes, los que estaban lejos, como a los que estaban cerca. Así, unos y otros podemos acercarnos al Padre, por la acción de un mismo Espíritu." Una visión cristiiana católica nos recuerda que somos una sola familia humana. Rezamos "Padre nuestro, no Padre mío". Estamos llamados a amar a nuestros hermanos y hermanas. Incluso se nos desafía a amar a "nuestros enemigos". Esta es la verdadera llamada a ser un auténtico discípulo de Jesucristo.

Jesús es la fuente de la auténtica paz. La paz es un fruto del Espíritu Santo. La paz no es algo que podamos autogenerar. Debemos ir a la fuente. En primer lugar, debemos profundizar en nuestra vida de oración. Debemos esforzarnos por escuchar Su voz, no la voz del mundo secular. En segundo lugar, debemos recordar que estamos llamados a ser un instrumento de paz. Todos debemos hacer un examen de conciencia: ¿de qué manera contribuyo o disminuyo la paz en mi vida? Con la ayuda de Dios, nos esforzamos por alinear nuestra vida con la de Jesucristo. Sí, vivimos en un mundo roto, un mundo desgarrado por las luchas, en el plano espiritual, un mundo dirigido por el Enemigo. Sin embargo, Jesús vino a este mundo para salvarnos y rescatarnos. Él nos recuerda en el Evangelio de Juan: "En el mundo tendréis dificultades, pero tened valor, yo he vencido al mundo". Nuestra paz está en la unión con Él.

Mientras lloramos la pérdida de una vida, también debemos reevaluar nuestra relación con Dios. ¿En qué medida reflejo las prioridades de Dios? ¿O estoy proyectando mi propia agenda? Permitanme terminar con estas palabras, "Aprovechemos este momento para rezar por la unidad y el fin de la violencia y la retórica incendiaria en nuestra comunidad y en toda nuestra nación. Que haya paz en la tierra y que empiece conmigo".
