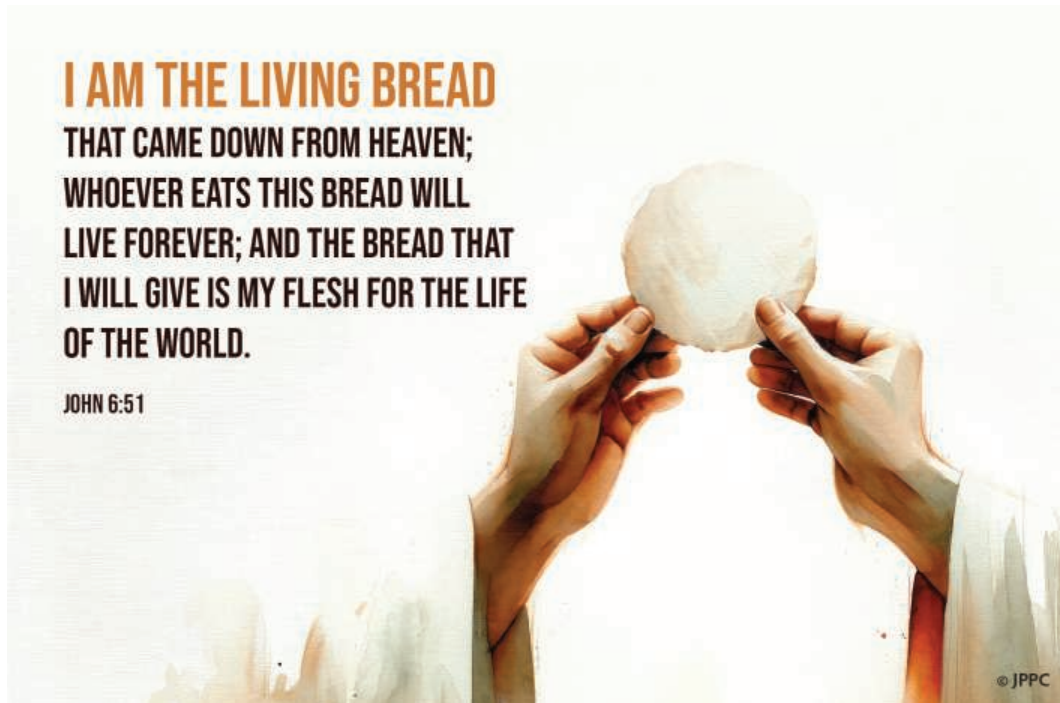

PASTOR'S NOTES

"This is enough, O Lord! Take, my life." These words are words of exhaustion, words of discouragement, words of despair. These words are taken from the first reading today from the prophet Elijah. Elijah was fleeing for his life and he was afraid. He was overwhelmed and wanted to give up. A messenger from God provided food and drink so that he could continue his journey. He ate and drank and the Scriptures tell us, "strengthened by that food, he walked 40 days and 40 nights to the mountain of God."

In the Gospel today, Jesus recounts how God provided "manna" in the desert so the Israelites, God's people, could make it to the promised land. There is a clear precedence that God provides for his people in the journey of life. Jesus uses this story to build upon his teaching of his greatest gift, the Holy Eucharist. He tells us, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven." Jesus is making the point that He is the food for our spiritual journey. He is saying just as you need physical nourishment to sustain your body, so too, you need spiritual sustenance to nourish your soul. He is saying, "I am your spiritual nourishment. Without me, you will shrivel up and die." Here is the plain truth, it is not optional. We need Jesus. Jesus is essential to our life. Without Jesus, we will die. With Jesus, we will live forever. How does Jesus enter into our lives, our being? Jesus becomes the living bread at every celebration of the Mass. This is my Body given for you.

Give us this day our daily bread. Jesus is our food for the journey. Yes, he nourishes us in his Word. But also, in a most intimate way, Jesus humbles himself, to become our food. In the Holy Eucharist, we are united with Jesus in a holy communion. When we realize this with the gift of supernatural faith, we realize that Jesus journeys with us always. He is the food which will nourish us, sustain us, and strengthen us to persevere in the journey until the end.

Our heavenly Father is a God of hope and encouragement. God sends us his Son to be the Bread of Life. He encourages us with the great gift of the Holy Eucharist. Yes, all of us, can experience moments of exhaustion, discouragement, and despair. But Jesus, the bread of life, wants to nourish us along our difficult journey of life. Jesus never abandons us!

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

ESCRITORIO DEL PASTOR

"Basta ya, Señor. Quítame la vida" Estas palabras son palabras de cansancio, palabras de desaliento, palabras de desesperación. Estas palabras están tomadas de la primera lectura de hoy del profeta Elías. Elías huía para salvar su vida y tenía miedo. Estaba abrumado y quería rendirse. Un mensajero de Dios le proporcionó comida y bebida para que pudiera continuar su viaje. Comió y bebió, y las Escrituras nos dicen que "fortalecido por aquel alimento, caminó 40 días y 40 noches hasta el monte de Dios".

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús relata cómo Dios proporcionó "maná" en el desierto para que los israelitas, el pueblo de Dios, pudieran llegar a la tierra prometida. Hay un claro precedente de que Dios provee a su pueblo en el camino de la vida. Jesús utiliza esta historia para desarrollar su enseñanza sobre su mayor don, la Sagrada Eucaristía. Nos dice: "Yo soy el pan vivo que ha bajado del cielo". Jesús nos está diciendo que Él es el alimento para nuestro camino espiritual. Nos está diciendo que, al igual que necesitamos alimento físico para mantener nuestro cuerpo, también necesitamos sustento espiritual para alimentar nuestra alma. Él está diciendo: "Yo soy tu alimento espiritual. Sin mí, te marchitarás y morirás". Esta es la pura verdad, no es opcional. Necesitamos a Jesús. Jesús es esencial para nuestra vida. Sin Jesús, moriremos. Con Jesús, viviremos para siempre. ¿Cómo entra Jesús en nuestra vida, en nuestro ser? Jesús se convierte en el pan vivo en cada celebración de la Misa. Este es mi Cuerpo entregado por Ustedes.

Danos hoy nuestro pan de cada día. Jesús es nuestro alimento para el camino. Sí, nos alimenta en su Palabra. Pero también, de la manera más íntima, Jesús se humilla para convertirse en nuestro alimento. En la Sagrada Eucaristía, estamos unidos a Jesús en una santa comunión. Cuando nos damos cuenta de esto con el don de la fe sobrenatural, nos damos cuenta de que Jesús viaja siempre con nosotros. Él es el alimento que nos nutrirá, nos sostendrá y nos fortalecerá para perseverar en el camino hasta el final.

Nuestro Padre celestial es un Dios de esperanza y aliento. Dios nos envía a su Hijo para que sea el Pan de Vida. Nos alienta con el gran don de la Sagrada Eucaristía.
