PASTOR'S NOTES

For the past four months, I have been working with our Envisioning Team made up of 10 active parishioners from both St. Anthony and Our Lady of Mercy parishes. Under the guidance of a Catholic Leadership coach, we have looked at the results of the Disciple Maker Index survey that we took last year. From this data and through our discussions, we have identified three main priorities from our parishes. From these priorities, we have developed 2 SMART goals for each of the priorities. Currently, we are working on specific strategies to carry out these goals for our parish over the next few years. I would like to share with you the 3 main priorities and a simplified rationale for each of them. The 3 main priorities include: **Welcoming and Hospitality, Confidence in Explaining the Teachings of the Faith, and Growing in Discipleship.**

In an increasingly disconnected world, people are yearning for community. The parish must serve as a place where all feel at home, whether they are lifelong members or newcomers. A culture of hospitality is foundational for building a vibrant, mission-driven parish where people want to belong.

In today's culture, many Catholics find it difficult to explain the reasons behind their faith when asked. Addressing this priority is crucial in forming intentional disciples who are prepared to live and share their faith confidently. Given the growing secularization of society, this priority takes precedence because it helps Catholics engage thoughtfully with their faith, especially when challenged or questioned.

Discipleship is the heart of the Christian life, yet many Catholics struggle to understand what it truly means to live as a disciple of Christ. In an increasingly individualistic society, there is a need for intentional focus on helping people understand their call to mission, both within the Church and in the world.

As we end the liturgical year, we look forward to growing as a community where our people experience joy and healing that comes from a loving relationship with Jesus Christ.

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

ESCRITORIO DEL PASTOR

Durante los últimos cuatro meses, he estado trabajando con nuestro Equipo de Visión formado por 10 feligreses activos de las parroquias de San Antonio y Nuestra Señora de la Misericordia. Bajo la guía de un entrenador de Liderazgo Católico, hemos analizado los resultados de la encuesta del Índice del Hacedor de Discípulos que realizamos el año pasado. De estos datos y a través de nuestras discusiones, hemos identificado tres prioridades principales de nuestras parroquias. A partir de estas prioridades, hemos desarrollado 2 objetivos SMART para cada una de las prioridades. Actualmente, estamos trabajando en estrategias específicas para llevar a cabo estos objetivos para nuestra parroquia durante los próximos años. Me gustaría compartir con ustedes las 3 prioridades principales y una justificación simplificada para cada una de ellas. Las 3 prioridades principales son: Acogida y Hospitalidad, Confianza en la Explicación de las Enseñanzas de la Fe, y Crecimiento en el Discipulado.

En un mundo cada vez más desconectado, la gente anhela la comunidad. La parroquia debe ser un lugar donde todos se sientan como en casa, ya sean miembros de toda la vida o recién llegados. Una cultura de hospitalidad es fundamental para construir una parroquia vibrante, impulsada por la misión, donde la gente quiera pertenecer.

En la cultura actual, a muchos católicos les resulta difícil explicar las razones de su fe cuando se les pregunta. Abordar esta prioridad es crucial para formar discípulos intencionales que estén preparados para vivir y compartir su fe con confianza. Dada la creciente secularización de la sociedad, esta prioridad tiene prioridad porque ayuda a los católicos a comprometerse reflexivamente con su fe, especialmente cuando se les desafía o cuestiona.

El discipulado es el corazón de la vida cristiana, sin embargo, muchos católicos luchan por entender lo que realmente significa vivir como discípulo de Cristo. En una sociedad cada vez más individualista, es necesario centrarse intencionadamente en ayudar a las personas a comprender su llamada a la misión, tanto dentro de la Iglesia como en el mundo.

Al terminar el año litúrgico, esperamos crecer como una comunidad donde nuestra gente experimente la alegría y la sanación que viene de una relación amorosa con Jesucristo.

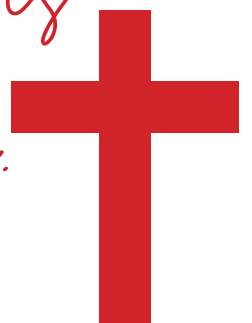
